

# FOLLOW YOUR ARROW

**H**alf Square Triangles are so versatile and are easy to make, and HST's create an endless supply of quilt patterns - here's just one idea. Want to make something completely different? Play with the layout on your design board, or change your colour!

## MATERIALS

finished size 64" x 64"

- 1.9m main colour (purple)
- 1.9m background colour (pink)
- batting and backing to fit
- .4m binding fabric
- matching thread
- ruler, rotary cutter and mat
- pencil
- pins



## MAKING THE HALF-SQUARE TRIANGLES

1. Cut (8) 8-7/8" strips from both main and background colours. Sub-cut each colour into (32) 8-7/8" squares.
2. Mark a diagonal line on the back of each of the background squares.
3. Place background square on top of main colour square, right sides together, and matching edges.
4. Stitch a line on both sides of your drawn line, 1/4" away from the line. Cut along drawn line.
5. Press the 64 HST's open, pressing seam to darker fabric.

## ASSEMBLY

1. Lay out HST's as shown in sample. Sew together into 8 rows of 8 HST blocks, pressing seams to alternating sides in each row. Sew rows together, pressing seams to one side.

## FINISHING

1. Layer quilt top, batting and backing, and quilt as desired. Add binding using your favourite method.

Try a different colour for a completely different look!  
Or make it scrappy and use up your stash!
